This iconic theatre is used by local and national artists and performers. It is named after Leicester's famous author, Sue Townsend.



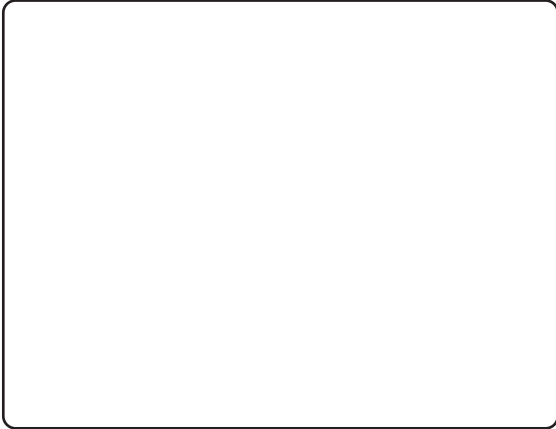

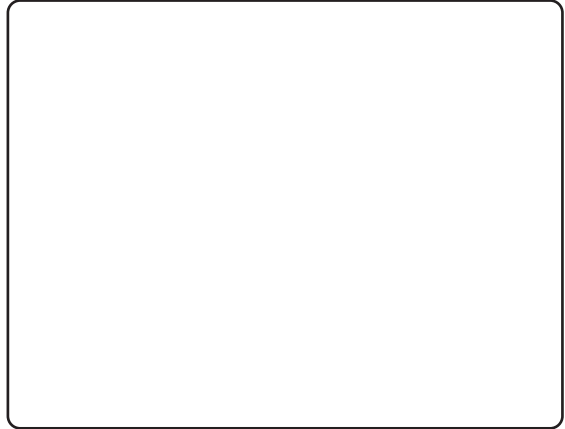
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
