PowerPoint presentation

The accompanying PowerPoint presentation has 22 slides with the following learning points:

- Slides 1 to 3: introduce the lesson and the learning aims.
- Slides 4 to 19: give a brief overview of the following art movements and famous artists during these periods of: Italian Renaissance, Baroque, Realism, Impressionism, Post-impressionism, Cubism, Surrealism and Pop Art.

Activity 1 (slides 20 and 21)

- Slides 20 and 21: introduce a research activity linked to art movements. Ask the children to pick an artist from one of the movements to research in greater depth. Why did they pick that artist? What do they like/dislike about their work? How does their art compare to others working at the same time? Children working at a greater level could research artists from other continents as a comparison. Record their findings in their sketchbooks.
- Slide 22: includes some key vocabulary to include on the working wall.
