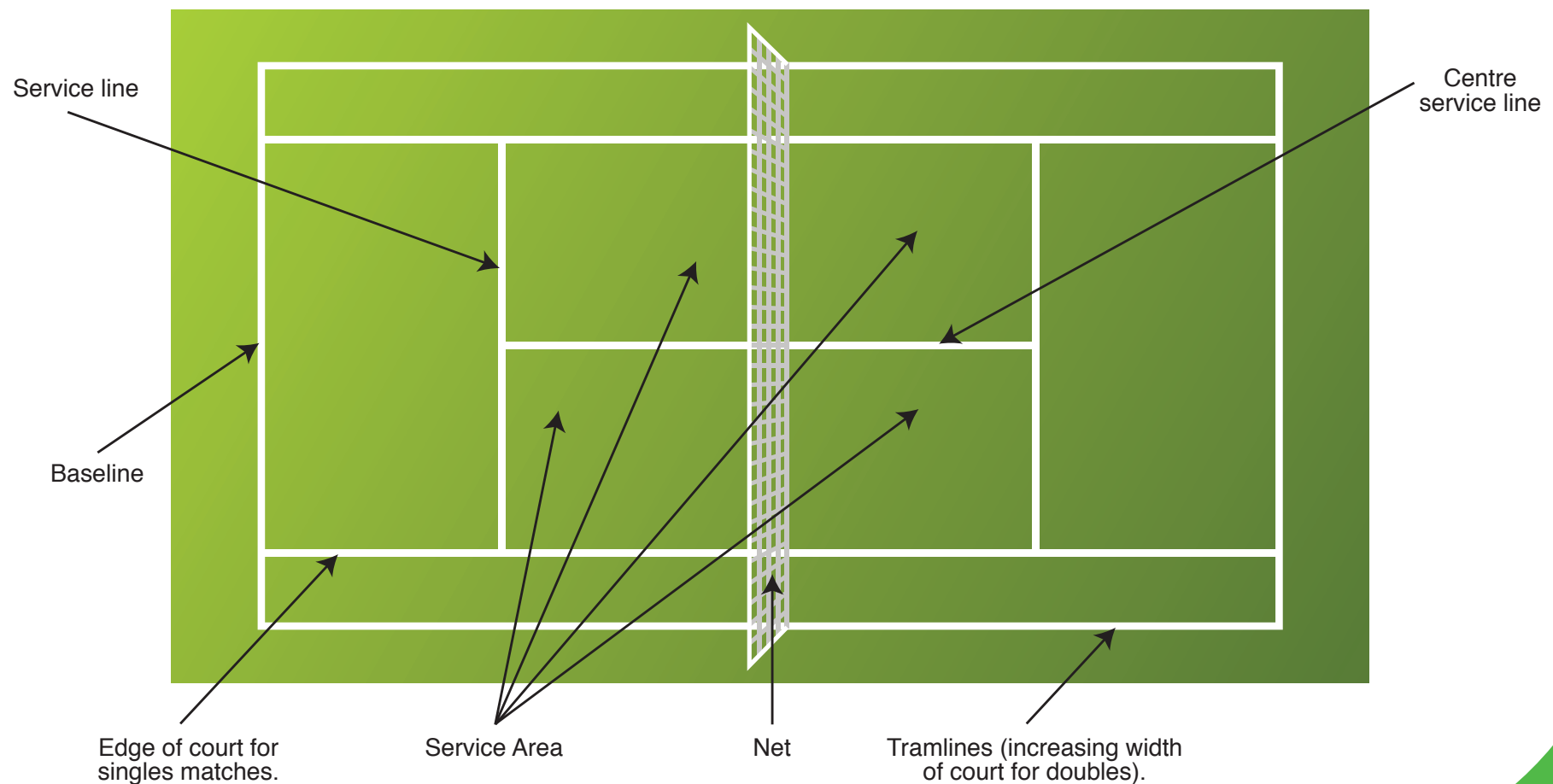
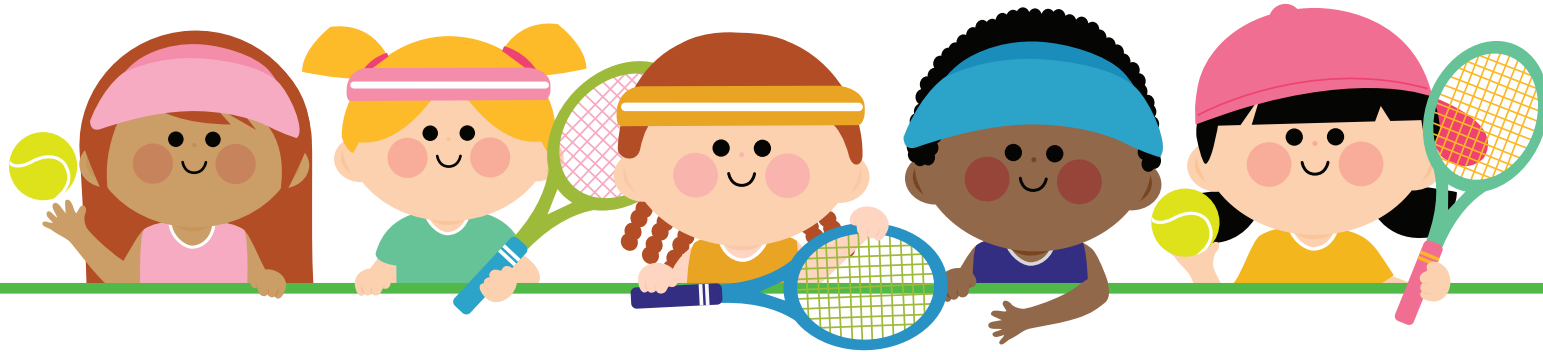


Your Guide to a Tennis Court





Scoring in Tennis

To win a match:

To win a match a player must win the best of three sets (except in “Grand Slams”, where men’s singles and doubles are the best of five sets).

To win a set:

A player must be the first to win six games. The player must be two points ahead, so if it is five games all, the winner must reach seven games. If a game reaches “Seven all”, there is a “tie-break”. The tie-break is the first to reach seven points, but they must also be two clear points ahead. In the last game of a set, there is no tie-break, so the winning player is two clear games ahead.

To win a game:

Each player begins with a score of 0, known as “Love.” The next time they score it is **Fifteen**, then **Thirty**, then **Forty**, then they win the **Game**.

If both players have forty points, the score is called “**deuce**”. The player must be two clear points ahead to win the game.

The next point won after “**deuce**” is “**Advantage**”.

The next point won after “**Advantage**” is the **game**.

If the other player wins the point, it goes back down to “**deuce**”.
